By mid century it is estimated there will be more than 16 million people living in long-term care facilities, many of them will be Alzheimer's patients. At the time, someone needs long term care there are several steps that need to be followed. There is a pre-screening and assessment that need to be done by the doctor and long-term care facility.

When looking for a long-term care facility there are several questions to be asked.

1. What type of atmosphere should you look for?
2. What opportunities are provided for my loved one to participate in meaningful activities?
3. Will my loved one be safe?
4. Is staff trained to handle the complex issues of caring for a person with Alzheimer's disease?
5. How will we pay for Alzheimer's care?

Fountainview has three wings for Alzheimer's care. One wing is for people with early stages of Alzheimer's with 33 beds and two smaller wings for people with advanced Alzheimer's disease. For more details, contact Amy at 362-7014.
